INTRODUCTION

Explore the Core Values of Japan Through the Life and Legacy of the Omi Merchants

For over 300 years, the Omi Merchants from Omihachiman, Hino, and Higashiomi in Shiga built networks using the region's resources. Their credo, *Sanpo Yoshi*—"Trilateral Benefit," or good for the buyer, the seller, and for society—was key to their success. This itinerary model offers insight into their philosophy, with historical towns, traditional cuisine, and unique accommodations reflecting how their values continue to shape both the region's and Japan's cultural spirit.

KEY DESTINATIONS



Hachimanbori (Hachiman Moat)

Premium Experience 2

Once a bustling hub for trade during the medieval period, the area thrived as a commercial center, playing a key role in the rise of Omi merchants. Today, there are picturesque views along the moat of the castle remains, where visitors can enjoy seasonal beauty and peaceful rowboat rides through this historically rich area.

Step back in time at this well-preserved merchant residence, now a museum showcasing the 400-year history and business practices of the Omi Merchants. The experience is enriched with the chance to savor authentic merchant-style cuisine, served in a traditional Japanese garden setting.

Wander through the tranquil streets of Gokasho Kondo, a merchant town where time seems to stand still. The beautifully preserved white-walled houses and traditional wooden storehouses offer a glimpse into the past, allowing visitors to experience the historical charm and peaceful lifestyle of this quiet, picturesque community.

3- Day Sample Course

Day 1: Omihachiman Historic Merchant Town

- Enjoy a scenic boat ride along the historic Hachimanbori (see Page 3)
- Enjoy an Omi Beef lunch, a premier wagyu renowned for its tenderness.
- Take a leisurely walk through Shinmachi Street, lined with historic merchant houses

Day 2: Hino Historic Merchant Town

- Visit one of the merchant houses with 400 years of history.
- Enjoy a traditional soba lunch at Morisada, housed in a renovated merchant residence.
- Visit the tranquil Watamuki Shrine, tied deeply to the lives of local merchants.

Day 3: Higashiomi Historic Merchant Town

- Try your hand at traditional weaving at the Omi Jofu Traditional Industry Hall.
- A guided tour at the Fujii Honke Sake Brewery with a sake-paired lunch.
- Visit the Omi Merchant Museum for a deeper look at merchant culture.
- Stroll through the picturesque Gokasho Kondo area.

Note: The course can be tailored to a single day according to your preferences.



SHIGA SPECIALITIES

Fermented Foods

Shiga is known for its rich fermentation tradition, including Funazushi, made by salting and fermenting Lake Biwa's crucian carp in rice. The region also produces sake, miso, and vinegar. Omi merchants historically spread these fermentation techniques to other areas of Japan. Such fermented foods now receive global attention and praise for their health and beauty benefits.

Sake Tasting at Fujii Honke

Fujii Honke, a sake brewery established in 1831, offers a glimpse into traditional brewing methods. Enjoy a guided tour of the brewery, sample a variety of their sake, and savor local cuisine perfectly paired with the drinks, all while immersing yourself in the region's rich cultural heritage.

Activity Details	Highlights Built in the Taisho era, this brewery is a National Registered Tangible Cultural Property and a renowned filming location for various historical dramas. Guests can sample the "brewing water" used in the sake-making process during the experience. The deepest area of the brewery features a striking storage room made entirely of Japanese keyaki zelkova wood for a unique architectural experience. Plan A: Sake Brewery Tour (30 mins) Explore facilities that are nationally designated as Registered Tangible Cultural Properties. Enjoy tasting the brewing water used in the sake-making process and learn about fermentation and storage methods. This tour offers an immersive experience of both Japanese history and the craft of sake brewing. Plan B: Meal and Sake Tasting (60 mins) Savor Kyokujitsu, a premium sake brand from Fujii Honke, brewed with Shiga's pure underground water and local rice, paired with seasonal ingredients unique to this area. Experience the refined flavors of sake crafted in a traditional wooden brewery, where the cultural, historical, and natural heritage of Shiga is meticulously preserved.
