Shichimi (Japanese spice)workshop

"Shichimi", which literally means "Seven flavors" in Japanese, is a popular seasoning in Kyoto. Although it was once used as medicine, many people now enjoy it as a spicy condiment for noodles and "nabe", a hot-pot. You can create your own "Shichimi" by mixing the main ingredient, coarsely ground red chili pepper with the naturally flavorful Japanese pepper, white sesame, black sesame, ginger, dried orange peel and seaweed.

Maki-e workshop

Maki-e, a technique developed mainly during the Heian Period (794 -1185), was created by sprinkling gold, silver or platinum powder over jet-black lacquerware. It blossomed in the Edo Period (1603-1868) and the Maki-e objects that were initially designed as household items for court nobles soon gained more popularity and were adopted by royal families and military leaders as a symbol of power.

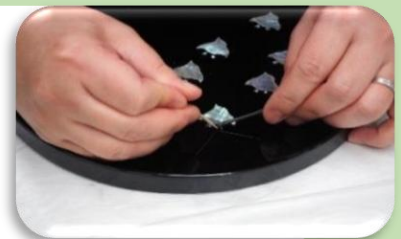

Raden workshop

Raden is a traditional Japanese decorative technique in which inlays of shell are used to decorate wood base items, whether lacquered or not. It can also be done on metal base items or other materials. The shells generally used include mother-of-pearl and abalone.

Iroetsuke workshop

Learn traditional techniques of Kashoku, ways of decorating lacquerware handed down in Kyoto. Iroetsuke is a technique of painting pictures with colored Urushi lacquer.

Gold leaf stamping workshop

Gold leaf stamping technique, originally used for decoration of various religious furnishings, fittings and statues in Buddhist temples, consists of gluing gold leaves to the plane or three-dimensional surface with the help of urushi lacquer. Please enjoy creating your own personal piece of art using the world's thinnest and finest Gold leaf!
